THE 46^{TH} CSIT CONGRESS WEEK TOOK PLACE IN LOUTRAKI, GREECE, FROM 14 TO 20 OCTOBER. TRADITIONALLY HELD IN THE AUTUMN BEFORE THE COMING CSIT WORLD SPORT GAMES. THE 8^{TH} EDITION OF THE WSG WILL TAKE PLACE FROM 3 TO 8 JUNE 2025, ALSO IN LOUTRAKI ON THE BEAUTIFUL GULF OF CORINTH.

he congress was perfectly prepared and organised by the Greek member association HOCSH. Thanks again for the organisation and the pleasant and stress-free time and the warm hospitality shown to the entire CSIT family in Loutraki and the very interesting and informative guided tours to the sports venues for the WSG2025 and the spectacular Greek archaeological sites nearby.

The congress day was meticulously organised and full of important information and decisions for the upcoming important dates at CSIT. Foremost the WSG2025 in Loutraki, but also the presentation of Aalborg as a candidate for the WSG2027 as well as some technical decisions regarding sports for the WSG and the new CSIT App 2.0. 

THE CSIT EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETS SEVERAL TIMES A YEAR TO DISCUSS THE MANY CURRENT AND FUTURE PROJECTS OF THE GLOBAL ASSOCIATION. REFLECT ON THE ASSOCIATION'S STRATEGY AND FIND NEW WAYS TO MAKE THE CSIT EVEN MORE ATTRACTIVE AND FUTURE ORIENTATED. IN 2024, THREE MEETINGS WERE HELD IN LIÈGE IN BELGIUM, IN SOUTHERN STYRIA IN AUSTRIA AND AS PART OF THE CSIT CONGRESS IN LOUTRAKI IN GREECE.

TOP MEETING IN LIEGE

The new CSIT ExCom was elected and installed at the CSIT Congress in Barcelona in October 2023. The first official meeting of the newly formed board, chaired by CSIT President Bruno Molea, took place in Liège (Belgium). The agenda included strategic discussions and reports on CSIT's individual areas of activity as well as meetings with local politicians and leaders from Liège and a visit to the Walloon parliament with individual parliamentarians.

City Hall and Walloon parliament

CSIT President Bruno Molea and some members of the CSIT ExCom

had the opportunity to meet with some of the country's leading sports officials and politicians. They were invited to the city hall of Liège, to meet the Ministers Vice-President of the Parliament, Mrs. Christie Morreale as well as Mr. Frédéric Daerden and the former Olympian Philippe Saive.

Inclusion Sport and Stop Racism in Sport

Thierry Witsel, Member of the Parliament, took the opportunity to give a presentation at the CSIT ExCom on the important topics of "Inclusive Sport" and "Stop Racism in Sport". Belgium's table tennis icon, seven-time Olympian Jean-Michel Saive, President of the Belgian Olympic Committee since

2021, was a guest at the closing gala dinner of the CSIT ExCom at the Van Der Valk Selvs Hotel.

E-Learning Youth Academy

CSIT's Young Leaders were also present in Liège, where they presented their most recently completed projects to the ExCom and outlined and planned their next steps in working groups. And they had the opportunity to discuss with all the ExCom members. The feedback was consistently positive and the comments very encouraging and motivating for further projects.







SPECTACULAR IN AUSTRIA

The newly elected ExCom of the CSIT met for the second time from June 20 to 23. The meeting was held in one of the most beautiful regions of Austria, in southern Styria "Südsteiermark", which is also known internationally as Austria's Tuscany. A wine-growing region on the border with Slovenia, which is known far beyond the borders of the nation as one of the most beautiful tourist regions in Europe.

Almost complete

The meeting was organized by the Austrian CSIT member ASKÖ under the patronage of ASKÖ President Hermann Krist and ASKÖ Vice-President Thomas Zacharias, who is also active in the CSIT ExCom and also holds the position of CSIT Vice-President of the International Amateur Sports Federation. Special thanks to the ASKÖ team, that organized great days and were perfect hosts. Almost the entire ExCom had traveled to southern Styria. Only the Israeli colleague attended the meeting via internet stream due to the special circumstances in their country.

A look into the future

The ExCom meeting also included several task force meetings on the further development of the WSG. Decisions on new memberships were also made. Associations from Serbia, Luxembourg, Slovakia and Croatia to be accepted as soon as the final application procedure is completed. In general, there are still a few requests in the pipeline.

LAST MEETING IN LOUTRAKI

The last meeting of the CSIT ExCom in 2024 took place as part of the congress in October in Loutraki, Greece. The main focus was, of course, on preparing for the upcoming World Sport Games next June and getting in the perfect mood for the CSIT's biggest sporting event, that takes place every two years. The ExCom members had the opportunity to see all the sports venues for the Games in Loutraki in person, got a preview on the CSIT WSG2025 and gain an impression of how the 2025 Games will be organised next summer in Greece.

n Loutraki, the interactive part for all visitors was a demonstration of Catch'n Serve Ball, the new world association recently founded by CSIT. Participants from Greece, who had taken the day off from work to come to Loutraki, as well as numerous Forum partici-

pants, played a show match under the guidance of Catch'n Serve Ball President Elisabeth Speiser-Havel and visibly enjoyed the performance. Before the show, Georgios Gkionis, the Mayor of Loutraki, HOCSH President Nikos Kerassovitis, the organiser of the Forum and WSG2025, and CSIT President Bruno Molea gave the opening speeches.

After the lunch break, there were some very interesting presentations in the congress centre of the facility. The first was about energy-efficient heating of swimming pools by extracting heat from the ground. This



is a very interesting technology that is already being used in the public swimming pool in Loutraki and could even set a precedent worldwide. Elisabeth Speiser-Havel then gave an overview of the Catch'n Serve Movement, which has gained enormous momentum in recent months with the support of CSIT President Molea and the CSIT Office in Vienna and Rome.

In the end, CSIT's EU co-funded projects were the big topic. In particular, the three projects. GREENACA, YouCAMP and PLAYS, that were finalised in 2024. GREENACA was an

Science provides evidence of the benefits of sport for the daily lives of people and communities. These will be the pillars of the presentations

academy focussing on environmental sustainability in grassroots sports, in which five CSIT member associations (AICS, HLA, TUL, UCEC, Sport Camp) and the CSIT itself took part. YouCAMP was about youth camps that were developed and organised in six nations (Italy, Croatia, Spain, Austria, Greece, Finland). PLAYS was about practical learning to advance Youngsters in Sports.

The public forum was organised for the first time in Rome in 2019 and since its inception has been a platform for discussions on current issues and innovative ideas in and around sport, as well as a showcase for the many EU co-funded CSIT projects. It also serves as a collection of best practices in sport promotion with regard to healthy lifestyles, equality and social inclusion and as inspiration for all members and partners.

INTERNATIONAL PRESENCE OF CSIT by Raimund Fabi, CSIT Media Officer







n 2024, CSIT President Bruno Molea and his team attended both the SportAccord World Sport & Business Summit in Birmingham/UK and the SportAccord IF Forum in Lausanne/SUI, where they met with key decision-makers in international sport. "New networks are created, you get to know sports politics across borders, the

biggest representatives of international sport come together there. A crossroads where each of us - elite sport and grassroots sport - can strengthen relationships, but above all a great training school", said Bruno Molea after the meetings.

SPORTACCORD WORLD SPORT & BUSINESS SUMMIT IN BIRMINGHAM

SportAccord is the most influential gathering of global sport and brings together International Federations and organisations involved in the business of sport under the patronage of the IOC. At the beginning of April more than 1,700 attendees from 65 different countries travelled to Birmingham and the West Midlands/UK from across the globe for a packed agenda of high-level meetings, conferences, exhibitions, networking, and social events. CSIT was represented both as a confederation and for the first time as an exhibitor with a stand and had a full program right from the start.

CSIT President Bruno Molea (visibly satisfied with the investment in the exhibition stand) and his team (General Secretary Wolfgang Burghardt, Head of International Projecting Office Valeria Gherardini and Administrative Secretary Samuel

Szihn) presented CSIT as well as its 8th CSIT World Sport Games, which will be held in Loutraki, Greece June 3-8, 2025. CSIT welcomed as quest SportAccord Vice Presidents AIMS President Stephan Fox (AIMS the international Alliance of Independent Recognized Members of Sport) as well as ARIFS President Raffaele Chiulli (Association of IOC Recognised International Sports Federations). The meetings also included CISM, the International Military Council, President Nilton Gomes Rolim Filho and Secretary General Roberto Recchia. Another meeting took place among others with CSIT Co-Operations Partner FICS and Dr. Brian Nook, Dr. Fayd Deane and Dr. Bradly Sandler, with Thailand's Governor of Sports and many representatives of international sports federations as well as potential host cities for CSIT sporting events.

SPORTACCORD IF FORUM IN LAUSANNE

This year's IF FORUM at the Sport Accord in Lausanne in October was dedicated to many different topics, all focussing on the future of Sports. Challenges and opportunities of the future, dedicated to strengthening the capacity of international





to keep up with the changing times. **IOC Vice President Nicole Hoevertsz** Oly delivered a clear message in Lausanne: "Keeping up with the times means being ready for change and being flexible. From an in-depth analysis of the Paris Olympics 2024 we can draw important lessons for the preparation of the 2026 Milan Cortina Winter Olympics."

CSIT was present in Lausanne with President Bruno Molea, Secretary General Wolfgang Burghardt and Valeria Gherardini, head of the Projecting International Office. Bruno Molea stated: "In particular, Al and the benefits arising from it, the importance of gender equality, the involvement of young people and the role of social media in promoting participation and prominence were emphasised. At this edition of the FORUM, the IOC announced the inaugural edition of the e-sports Olympics, that will be staged in 2025. This too is a sign of keeping up with the times, dealing with e-sports means dealing with young people. And the message the IOC was giving us is clear: where young people are, Sport must be too. This year's IF FORUM was also dedicated to Al. lights and shadows of the tools that accompany us into the future. The topics are many, and as president of CSIT I was there to meet the many international organisations present at this edition of the forum, 400 delegates and experts from all over the world."

Bruno Molea continues: "After three days at the IF Forum organised by SportAccord, I can say: what a great opportunity! The whole grassroots sports world should be there. They talked about emerging needs, artificial intelligence, youth policy, gender equality, the ability to keep up with the times, sport as the centre of a perfect mechanism for growth and participation. And they also talked about hot current topics, such as the high cost of the Olympic Games (increased exponentially, beyond all expectations and limits, in a few decades) or the protection policy to protect athletes from any form of abuse."

AIOS MEETING IN LAUSANNE

Bruno Molea is the president of the Association of International Organisations for Sport.

In the framework of the IF Forum SportAccord in Lausanne President Bruno Molea held a meeting of AIOS, the Association of International Organisations for Sport, which he chairs as CSIT representative.

AIOS, an association registered in Switzerland, is the organized group of the former Associate Members of GAISF, in concrete several international multi-sports organisations, also FICS (Federation Internationale de Chiropratique du Sport), IAKS (International Association For Sports and Leisure Facilities) or WFSGI (World Federation of the Sporting Goods Industry). Among those present were Pierre Zappelli and Giorgio Chinellato (Panathlon International). Dr. Martin Isaksson and Dr. Bradley Sandler (FICS), to name just a few.

Together the group updated on the next possible members and the role of AIOS in Sportaccord and especially on its possible entry in the SportAccord board as observer. In the afternoon Bruno Molea had a meeting with the SportAccord President about it. "The entry of grassroots sport and organisations that do not practice élite sport in SportAccord would be an important recognition of the work of those who struggle every day to promote sport as a tool for healthy lifestyle and education", stated Bruno Molea. 💢









SPORTS for all genders and sexualities

THE INTERSECTION OF DIVERSITY, INCLUSION, AND THE FIGHT AGAINST DISCRIMINATION HAS BECOME A CRITICAL FOCUS FOR THE SPORTS WORLD, BOTH ELITE AND AMATEUR. FUNDED BY THE EUROPEAN UNION, THE SPORT FOR ALL GENDERS AND SEXUALITIES SGS PROJECT SEEKS TO FOSTER AN INCLUSIVE SPORTS CULTURE THAT WELCOMES ALL INDIVIDUALS, REGARDLESS OF GENDER IDENTITY OR SEXUAL ORIENTATION. BY BREAKING DOWN ENTRENCHED BARRIERS IN EUROPEAN GRASSROOTS SPORTS, THE PROJECT AIMS TO FIGHT SEXISM, HOMOPHOBI AND TRANSPHOBIA TO ADVANCE A VISION OF SPORTS AS A SPACE OPEN AND WELCOME FOR ALL.









GOOD PRACTICES REPORT

The very first deliverable of SGS, the Good Practices Report identified successful examples of institutional inclusion for gender-diverse athletes across five partner countries: Spain, Italy, Austria, Germany, and the Netherlands. This report provided actionable insights for national and international sports organizations, offering guidance on eliminating barriers for transgender, intersex, and non-binary individuals and ensuring long-term commitment to inclusion.

REGIONAL WORKING GROUPS IN PARTNER COUNTRIES

To deepen engagement and tailor solutions to local needs, regional working groups (RWGs) were launched in five countries. These groups convene diverse stakeholders—including LGBTQI individuals, grassroots sports clubs, and national associations—to exchange knowledge and strategies. Beginning in January 2023, RWGs have hosted regular meetings to share best practices, discuss progress of the project, and adapt SGS measures for regional contexts.

SITUATION OF WOMEN AND LGBT+ INDIVIDUALS IN EUROPEAN GRASSROOTS SPORTS

A study conducted by the German Sports University in Cologne explored gender norms and stereotypes in European grassroots sports. Surveying 2,832 participants from various roles and identities, the research revealed high levels of discrimination, persistent biases, and a pressing need to promote gender and sexual diversity. These findings underscored the urgency of addressing exclusion in sports and informed the SGS approach.

OPEN YOUR SPORT TO ALL GENDERS AND SEXUALITIES

The Rising Together campaign is a flagship initiative of the SGS project, aiming to spread its deliverables and core message of inclusivity. Through social media actions, stories from athletes, and multilingual outreach, the campaign challenges stereotypes and advocates for diversity as a strength. The use of rugby visuals highlights how differences in physicality are a resource, not a disadvantage, demonstrating that all sports can benefit from embracing diversity. The campaign's slogan, "Rising Together - Open your sport to all genders and sexualities!", reinforces the belief that sports thrive when no one is left behind.

EVENTS TO MULTIPLY THE KNOW-HOW AND AWARENESS AMONG KEY STAKEHOLDERS

Train-the-Trainers Seminar in Seville

This event managed to bring together trainers and educators from participating countries, equipping them with practical tools to implement inclusive practices in their local sports organizations. Participants gained insights into strategies for fostering open, welcoming sports environments that embrace all genders and sexualities, as well as exchanged ideas on how to promote equality in grassroots sports.

SGS Stakeholder Seminar at the CSIT World Amateur Sports Forum

Using the platform of the CSIT World Amateur Sports Forum, the SGS project hosted a comprehensive stakeholder seminar to showcase its progress and deliverables. Partner organizations from across Europe shared insights on implementing gender and sexual equality measures, fostering collaborative brain-

storm-

ing, and addressing challenges in grassroots sports. An interactive discussion with attendees underscored the importance of inclusion, with participants describing the seminar as "refreshing" and "well-tempered."

SGS at the EuroGames in Vienna

The EuroGames, Europe's largest LGBTQI+ sports event, provided a vibrant platform for promoting the SGS project's mission. SGS partner organization representatives paticipated in the sports conference, panel discussions, met over a partner meeting, and also took active part in side events like the Catch'n'Serve Ball Match, which highlighted inclusivity by integrating all genders and sexualities into the game.

The end of the project, the beginning of change

The SGS project has been a driver for transformation in European grass-roots sports, fostering meaningful dialogue. By challenging entrenched norms, encouraging collaboration, and celebrating diversity, SGS demonstrated that inclusivity is more than an aspiration – it is an achievable reality.

While progress has been made, challenges remain, such as resistance to accommodating individuals beyond the traditional male and female binary. However, the spirit of Rising Together reminds us that by embracing inclusivity, we can elevate sports to new heights and create spaces where everyone feels they belong.









The BIG Wrap-Up of 3 CSIT EU Co-Funded Projects

hrough the three projects
CSIT has demonstrated its
commitment to addressing contemporary issues
in grassroots sports. The
projects have laid the groundwork
for future innovations, inspiring to
embrace inclusivity, sustainability,
and engagement with sports starting
from very young. The legacy of these
initiatives promises to shape the
future of grassroots sports across
Europe and beyond.

PLAYS PRACTICAL LEARNING TO ADVANCE YOUNGSTERS

PLAYS aimed to engage children aged 6-12 in sport through play to develop key skills. To encourage sports participation through structured, fun activities that support physical, social and emotional development.

A needs analysis at the start of the project in 2022 highlighted the barriers to participation due to a lack of resources for parents and carers. As a result, an online platform was set up with over 70 best practices. This resulted in a PLAYS guide

covering 10 key development areas, including cognitive and social skills, emotional self-regulation and motor skills. It also includes practical educational material, nutritional recommendations and practical methods.

The guide has been trialled in Romania (focusing on children with special needs), Italy (integrated into roller skating) and Portugal (tailored to swimming). These pilot projects have shown that the programme can be used in different contexts. At the CSIT Amateur Sports Forum, PLAYS and its tools were presented to the political decision-makers of the member associations and sports experts. At the end of the pilot phase, the consortium is examining PLAYS 2.0 in order to further expand its impact.

YOUCAMP INNOVATIVE SPORT ACTIVITIES IN INCLUSIVE SPORTS CAMPS

The project YouCAMP organised sports camps for young people between 14 and 19 to plan inclusive youth sports camps with a focus on gender equality and sustainability. In 2024, there were six national camps focusing on healthy lifestyles, gender equality and youth leadership.

The camps emphasised inclusivity with mixed-gender teams and developed innovative sports activities and traditional games for all ages. Participants actively co-designed activities, set inclusive rules and ensured accessibility. The young leaders were supported in working with the camp managers, gaining organisational and leadership experience. There were also cultural activities and presentations, making for a varied experience.

At the CSIT Amateur Sports Forum, the six camp projects were presented and evaluated by the participants, who voted for the most inspiring initiative. The feedback from the participants emphasised the transformative effect.

YOUCamp has successfully expanded the CSIT's network of young leaders and brought innovative approaches to grassroots sport.

















GREENACA PROMOTING GREEN GRASSROOTS SPORTS

GreenAca set up an academy to provide managers and coaches in grassroots sport with the tools to implement environmentally sustainable practices. The aim was to sensitise children and families, particularly in rural areas, to the importance of environmental sustainability in grassroots sport.

Strategies were developed to promote a more environmentally friendly

sports environment. GreenAca guidelines provided actionable protocols for waste minimisation, energy efficiency and resource conservation. Case studies highlighted best practice for transport, venue and digital processes.

There were also outdoor events for children aged 6 to 13 and their families with a focus on sustainability. Hiking, running and cycling combined with environmental awareness. Best practices for waste reduction, resource conservation and ecosystem education.

The highlight was the GreenAca workshop in Loutraki organised by the University of Seeburg Castle. Grassroots sports staff took part in training sessions that combined digital tools and live workshops, gaining practical knowledge and a toolkit for integrating sustainability into sports activities.

GreenAca set a new standard for integrating sustainability into grassroots sports and promoted community engagement and intergenerational dialogue.





hese are the goals of the three national sports promotion projects that will continue until 2025 with contributions from Italian public institutions: Team sports and games in schools; Sports for all kindergartens - united against dropouts; and CoESport - Community and Sport to promote healthy lifestyles and cohesive communities.

The projects will involve dozens of provinces across Italy and more than 10,000 young people as well as hundreds of qualified sports coaches. The goal is to engage young people and introduce them to sports as a happy place where they can find refuge and be in good company.

TEAM SPORTS AND GAMES AT SCHOOL

The project is funded by the Italian Minister of Sport through the government's Ministry of Sport. The free sports activities will begin

in November 2026 and currently include schools in 26 Italian provinces. The plan offers in detail 4 hours per week for 6 consecutive months of multi-sport practice to improve the entire sports offering in schools for all students aged 6 to 14.

But it does not stop there and does not exhaust its action with the school. The project aims to collaborate with schools to establish meaningful contact with families in such a way that school-based motor practice activities promote participation in









multi-sport events outside of school, where the families of the students and the public have the

To then promote cohesion, the project does not limit itself to inclusive sports activities and sports festivals. In fact, the project introduces a board game aimed at promoting cooperation among the youngest, respect, and fair play. The "Serious Game" will be called "SOS Space Operation Challenge" and will be used in classrooms to promote a sense of responsibility in attitudes and behaviors that strengthen social cohesion.

"NURSERIES" OF SPORT FOR ALL UNITĒD ĀĞĀINST DROP OUT

The project is promoted by AiCS and carried out with financial support from Sport e Salute S.p.A.

- the state-owned company that supports grassroots sports. It includes 21 Italian provinces, which will

start sports activities in places most frequented by young people, particularly in the suburbs, from January 2025. These so-called "Kitas" will offer all young people sports opportunities, with a particular focus on those aged 11 to 16, and therefore are aimed at socialization. It begins with open sports days for families and not just for young people, and then continues until March 2025 with 3 months of sports activities and five different disciplines.

The open days are not only meant to introduce the project but also to train the coaching teams. The goal is to support the growth of future generations and make them responsible. For each participating province, AiCS will activate 3 kindergartens, organizing 2 weekly multidisciplinary hours (for 5 different sports) and dedicating one hour to socialization. The active role of individuals in sociocultural processes should also be stimulated,

paying attention to the generation gap among school dropouts, gender differences, and the impact on the number of sports activities, as well as the prevention of social discomfort among young people.

PROMOTION OF HEALTHY LIFESTYLE AND COHESI COMMUNITIES

The project is active in no fewer than 40 Italian provinces, of which 16 are directly involved in the AiCS network. It is financially supported by Sport e Salute Spa and targets young people and children aged 5 to 16. It aims to provide them with sports "at home" in the shelters and targets young people who are most at risk of isolation and discrimination.

Sports should be ensured for children and young people who are not active or cannot be active in basic sports circles. Access should also be created for "vulnerable" youth who are at an increased risk of social isolation, as well as for minors who are not connected to the AiCS club network.





TRANSPLANT FOOTBALL WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

AICS ORGANISED IN SEPTEMBER THE FIRST TRANSPLANT FOOTBALL WORLD CUP ON THE ROMAGNA COAST IN CERVIA, THE CITY OF THE 7TH CSIT WORLD SPORTS GAMES 2023. AN INTERNATIONAL 7-A-SIDE FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT IN WHICH ONLY MALE AND FEMALE FOOTBALLERS WHO HAVE HAD AN ORGAN TRANSPLANT (HEART, LUNG, LIVER, KIDNEY OR BONE MARROW) TOOK PART. AICS THUS TOOK AN IMPORTANT STEP ON THE FOOTBALL PITCH TO CELEBRATE THE GIFT OF LIFE AND ORGAN DONATION.







he Cup, promoted by the World Association of Transplant Games, was organised in collaboration with ANED, the Italian Association for Haemodialysis, Dialysis and Transplantation, and was supported by the Italian Minister of Sport and the Italian Paralympic Committee. AiCS was entrusted with the difficult task of technical and medical organisation.

More than 300 people from all over the world met in Cervia, including 180 transplanted football players from 11 different nations. The winner was the national transplant football team from Chile. But the event was not just about sport, however, but also included plenty of socialising, a public conference on the topic of organ transplantation as a global right and the role of sports in patient management before and after transplantation. All with esteemed quests, professionals, patients, and witnesses sharing their successes and hopes in the field of organ transplantation.

For 45 years, the World Transplant Games Federation WTGF has been committed to improving the lives of transplant patients by encouraging them to participate in Olympic events and raising awareness of the success of transplantation as a medical therapy. It enables seriously ill people to regain health and prosperity through the miracle of organ donation.

The WTGF Board approved and enabled with the World Cup the launch of a major initiative and an exciting international event for transplant football. Modelled on the FIFA World Cup. teams from the association's member countries competed against each other in a World Cup format. The event also provided comprehensive medical care with four specialists on the sidelines and in the social facilities - all to ensure the care and safety of the participants.

NOT JUST SPORTS

The opening ceremony began with the march of the 11 teams as well as the representation of the World Transplant Games Federation and thrilled the participants with the football freestyle show featuring Italy's most famous freestyler, Antonio Colella.

At the concluding gala dinner and closing ceremony, the winners from Chile and all participants from Australia, Chile, England, France, Ireland, Northern Ireland, Italy, Romania, Spain, the USA, and Wales were honored.

At the end there was a great message, initiated by the winning team: The Chilean players demanded two gold medals for each of their players: one for the transplanted football player and one for the mostly unknown donor. A clear message to remind that without organ donation, the participants would not have been able to be there.

So much life in all of this.





Back in the Game Camp RETURN TO RAGE

THE AGWA (AMATEUR GRIDIRON WORLD ASSOCIATION) LAUNCHED THE "BACK IN THE GAME" PROJECT IN ITALY AT THE BEGINNING OF 2024 TO REBUILD THE WOMEN'S TACKLE SECTION OF ITALIAN AMERICAN FOOTBALL, WHICH DISAPPEARED AFTER THE CANCELLATION OF THE CHAMPIONSHIPS A FEW YEARS AGO, AND TO GIVE MANY GIRLS THE OPPORTUNITY TO RETURN TO THE FIELD AND TRY OUT THIS SPORT.







he sports program is aimed at all women of all ages, players who are not registered in a team and members with initial experience. In this way, many can continue their sporting career, and others can try out a sport that really enables every girl to play a role in this sporting disciplin.

In the last 12 months, the projecThe "Back in the Game" project, the only women's American football project active in Italy, started on 14 April 2024 in Piacenza. It is structured with a detailed calendar and already has a series of monthly meetings in different regions and cities in Italy. The meetings consist of training sessions on fixed days and at fixed times, thus offering everyone the opportunity to participate and promote the growth of a group that can revitalise an Italian representative.

The project that gave rise to the

'Scarlet Phoenix Team' has already played international friendly matches, such as the one on 23 November 2024 in Garbagnate Milanese against the English team Titans of Manchester. The next one will be played on 15 February 2025 in Florence against the Mexican Centinels team, in order to preserve the possibility of ensuring gender equality in American football as well and to grow this movement in every corner of Italy.

The Garbagnate game in November was the highlight of the event 'Women and sport, a story that needs to be written'. It was organised by AGWA in view of the International Week for the Elimination of Violence against Women to raise awareness of this issue among the sports community.

In addition to the full co-operation and sponsorship of the municipality of Garbagnate Milanese, the event also received the patronage of the Lombardy Region.

The event has been recognised by the Milan Cortina 2026 Foundation for its accessibility and inclusion, its environmental and social sustainability and its impact on the community, among other things, by joining the Italy of the Games project. This aims to promote and enhance the impact of sports initiatives related to the 2026 Winter Games.

AT THE IMPRESSIVE AND COLORFUL CELEBRATORY EVENT FOR THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF ASKÖ AT THE MUSEUM ARBEITSWELT IN STEYR IN OCTOBER, ASKÖ PRESIDENT HERMANN KRIST WELCOMED NUMEROUS GUESTS OF HONOR FROM POLITICS, SPORTS POLITICS, SCIENCE, SOCIETY AND EDUCATION IN ADDITION TO ASKÖ HONORARY MEMBERS, HONORARY PRESIDENTS, PROVINCIAL ASSOCIATION PRESIDENTS, PROVINCIAL ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVES AND GUESTS FROM OVER 40 CLUBS.

ormer ASKÖ Presidents

Sporting acts were of course a must at the anniversary celebration of the sports umbrella organization. Circus artist Susanne Haberl (originally a gymnast from ASKÖ Mattersburg), the representatives of ASKÖ Karate Steyr and the Graz Cheerleading Royals offered the quests impressive performances.

ASKÖ President Hermann Krist was able to state with satisfaction:

"This anniversary emphasizes the importance of ASKÖ as a powerful umbrella organization. In recent years, the powerful workers' association has become a modern and dynamic working group that has achieved and will continue to achieve a great deal for Austrian sport. We still have a lot to do and will also master the next few years well."

The ASKÖ was founded in 1924 as the first Austrian umbrella organization in Vienna as the "Workers' Association for Sport and Physical Culture" (then still "DER ASKÖ").







The federation had the task of uniting three previously independent workers' associations: The workers' gymnasts, the workers' cyclists and the friends of nature. Other workers' sports associations were added later. It has now been 100 years since its foundation, and today DIE ASKÖ (= Working Group for Sport and Physical Culture) is one of the three

major Austrian sports umbrella organizations for cooperation, di-

versity, fair play, inclusion and social justice in sport. It is currently home to 4,425 member clubs with almost 170,000 volunteers and almost 1 million individual memberships.

by CSIT. These trained professionals have implemented this game from March to June and they are now actively implementing the Catch'n Serve Ball game in their schools across several regions.

Notably, the substantial participation of students in this game has successfully engaged individuals who were previously reluctant to engage in educational activities. Feedback collected from teachers and students regarding their experiences with this initiative has been overwhelmingly positive, highlighting the positive impact of Catch'n Serve Ball on the community.

Additionally, the growing positive clime and collaboration among school staff has significantly contributed to enhancing the overall quality of teaching and learning. We have developed awareness activities and





workshops with kids and their parents, grandparents, policymakers, politicians, and public audiences.

CATCH'N SERVE IN VARIOUS SCHOOLS

Even though the mothers are the focus, the children are part of the exercise program. This is why Catch'n Serve Ball is also regularly presented in various schools. The **Role** of HAND-TO-HAND COMBAT

THE WAR IN UKRAINE CONTINUES TO POSE A GREAT CHALLENGE TO THE NATION, YET THE UKRAINIAN PEOPLE SHOW UNWAVERING COURAGE IN THEIR FIGHT FOR FREEDOM AND INDEPENDENCE. IT IS A HEROIC STRUGGLE BY UKRAINE AGAINST AN ALMOST OVERPOWERING OPPONENT. DESPITE THE DIFFICULT CIRCUMSTANCES, THE ALL-UKRAINIAN FEDERATION OF HAND-TO-HAND COMBAT (RUKBO) HAS MANAGED TO HOLD ALL PLANNED COMPETITIONS, BOTH AT THE NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL LEVELS.

ne of the most significant events was the Ukrainian Hand-to-Hand Combat Championship, held in August, in the city of Bucha in the Kyiv region. Over 200 of the strongest athletes from 18 regions of Ukraine competed for top honors in various weight categories. Following the competition, the national team was formed, which will participate in the 8th World Sports Games (WSG) in Loutraki, to be held from June 3 to June 8, 2025.

At the initiative of the Ministry of Youth and Sports of Ukraine and the All-Ukrainian Federation of Hand-to-Hand Combat, a new section titled "Demonstration of Applied Techniques" is being introduced as part of a pilot project for adaptive hand-to-hand combat. The goal of this project is to create opportunities for war veterans and people with disabilities to reintegrate into active life through sport.

Yuriy Radchenko, President of the All-Ukrainian Federation of Hand-to-Hand Combat, stated:

"This is an example of the unbreakable will and spirit of our heroes. Join us in supporting veterans as they return to full life through sport. Glory to Ukraine!" Oleksiy Nikitenko, Deputy Minister of Youth and Sports of Ukraine and one of the project's initiators, added: "People with disabilities will have another

path to reintegrate into civilian life through the tatami."

Adaptive sports are now a key focus of many international and governmental organizations, as well as the All-Ukrainian Federation of Handto-Hand Combat. The primary aim of this direction is to help veterans and people with disabilities recover both physically and mentally, while promoting a healthy and active lifestyle through hand-to-hand combat.

The Federation demonstrates to the world how sport can become a powerful tool for recovery and resilience, even in the most challenging conditions. The Ukrainian national team is eagerly awaiting the 8th CSIT World Sports Games (WSG) in Loutraki next June. Yuriy Radchenko, President of the Ukrainian Federation of Hand-to-Hand Combat, noted: "The CSIT World Sports Games are a symbol of peace and friendship."









New Workers Sport Leagues in Iran

UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE FEDERATION OF AMATEUR AND WORKERS' SPORTS, FAWSI FOUNDED 2023 ITS OWN SPORTS LEAGUE IN IRAN. THE MAIN AIM WAS TO FURTHER INCREASE THE MOTIVATION AND ENTHUSIASM OF ATHLETES FOR THEIR SPORT.

here are numerous differences in the organisation of national championships for workers and the workers' sports league in Iran. But the national sports championships for workers are only organised once a year. However, workers' athletes have more opportunities to play sports when they participate in the ongoing FAWSI sports leagues, which are organised on a monthly or even weekly basis. This brings much more joy and incentives.

Although the Federation of Amateur and Workers' Sports in Iran organises most of its sporting events as part of the "National Sports Championships", FAWSI launched its own leagues in 2023 with futsal, darts and table tennis and even expanded the programme in 2024.

The inclusion of rules and regulations such as preparation methods, standardisation and appropriate organisation in the FAWSI leagues is intended to further increase the quality and performance level of the workers' athletes.

FIRST WOMEN MOUNTAINEERS' ASCEND OF MOUNT ARARAT

For the first time, the Federation of Amateur and Workers Sports of Iran (FAWSI) decided to allow women to participate in an international mountaineering abroad. A group of 13 female mountaineers from Iran climbed the 5137 meters high summit of Mount Ararat in Turkey and hoisted the workers' flag on the mountain peak.

It was an important, extraordinary and tough sporting event. Soosan Daneshfar, the former FAWSI Vice President for Women's Affairs, was also in the group. Before the start of the tour, the FAWSI organised three preparation camps, which helped the women to adequately prepare for the upcoming efforts in the high alpine terrain. This magnificent and indescribable sporting event will forever have a prominent place in the records of the female mountaineers in Iran.

FAWSI REPRESENTATIVES MET CSIT PRESIDENT BRUNO MOLEA

Freestyle wrestling is one of the most popular and important sports in Asia. Therefore, FAWSI is very keen to send more participants to the CSIT World Sport Games in the coming years. Serious efforts are currently being made to include freestyle wrestling in the WSG2025 programme in Loutraki.

That is why Dr Bahman Mirzaei, Secretary General of the CSIT Technical Committee for Wrestling, was also present at the congress in Loutraki. The FAWSI President had a productive meeting with CSIT President Bruno Molea, who will try to facilitate this process. During the meetings, Bruno Molea also recognised the many national sporting activities of the FAWSI and will try to support the Iranian team in the next WSG in the best possible way.

A LARGE VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES

The "WSG2025" blend sport, history, and community in a unique event. Seniors are invited to move, laugh, and fully enjoy Greek culture. CSIT is looking forward to creating unforgettable moments with a large variety of activities. Each day offers two activity blocks, allowing participants to experience every part of the schedule. The range includes traditional Greek folk dance, "Walking Football" (a non-running version of soccer) along with innovative games like "Krolf" (a mix of croquet and golf). Other highlights include balance exercises with small rice bags and AQUA gymnastics to enhance motor skills and coordination.

WALKING FOOTBALL THE FUN TWIST ON SOCCER

Walking football is a specially adapted version of soccer where running is strictly prohibited, adding an amusing and strategic element to the game. Participants move across the field, promoting technique, teamwork and a fair play atmosphere. This activity welcomes everyone, regardless of their previous experience with soccer, and emphasizes community building through laughter and movement.

BALANCE TRAINING WITH RICE BAGS

This session uses small rice bags to strengthen core muscles, improve coordination, and develop motor skills essential for daily life. Balance exercises also help participants gain confidence and reduce the risk of falls, enhancing overall well-being. The focus on deep muscle engagement and reflex training makes this activity both practical and preventative.

AQUA-GYM

AQUA-gym sessions cater to seniors looking to combine fun and



fitness in a low-impact environment. Exercising in water not only supports the body but also adds resistance that helps improve strength and coordination. This activity is perfect for seniors looking for a refreshing way to stay active, and it provides inspiration for instructors working with older adults in aquatic settings.

ANCIENT GREEK SPORTS

This unique workshop immerses participants in the culture and practices of ancient Greek athletics. Beginning with an exploration of the history and significance of the Olympic Games in 776 BCE, the session then moves on to hands-on experiences with sports like long jump, running, javelin, and even a modified version of the ancient combat sport, pankration. WHEEL AND ROLL AGAINST HATE

THE "RKB SOLIDARITY GERMANY" TAKES A CLEAR STAND AGAINST RIGHT-WING EXTREMISM. RECENTLY, THE ELECTION RESULTS FOR THE SO-CALLED "ALTERNATIVE FOR GERMANY" HAVE BEEN IMPROVING AND MORE AND MORE RIGHT-WING EXTREMIST OFFENCES HAVE BEEN COMMITTED: THE RKB IS OBSERVING THE DANGEROUS SHIFT TO THE RIGHT IN GERMANY AND EUROPE WITH GROWING CONCERN AND IS TAKING A CLEAR STANCE AGAINST IT. IN THE LAST QUARTER OF 2023. THE ASSOCIATION WAS ALREADY ABLE TO IMPLEMENT VARIOUS MEASURES AS PART OF THE "WHEEL AND ROLL AGAINST HATE" PROJECT.



he project kicked off with a panel discussion in November, at which Dr Dieter Vaupel presented his new book "Radsport im Nationalsozialismus". An almost forgotten chapter in German sports history. Afterwards, Tobias Köck (Vice President of Association Development at the RKB), who initiated the project, Janina Sander (Federal Chairwoman of Solijugend, an independent youth association of the RKB), Dr Dieter Vaupel and Dr Ben Weinberg (member of the Executive Committee of the Centre for Human Rights and Sport) discussed the role and responsibility of clubs for civil society and democracy.

AGAINST RACISM. SEXISM, BODÝ **SHAMING AND HOMOPHOBIA**

To raise awareness of misanthropy in sport, a number of explanatory videos have also been produced. These are dedicated to four specific, widespread forms of group-based discrimination and marginalisation: racism, sexism, body shaming and homophobia. The aim was not only to provide a low-threshold, informative introduction to a complex topic, but also to communicate the organisation's stance unambiguously both internally and externally: Everyone



is welcome at the RKB and can find their place, regardless of origin, gender or appearance!

SPORT AND HUMAN RIGHTS A STRONG TEAM **#STRONGERTOGETHER**

In a three-part workshop, the participants at the 59th International Youth Encounters 2023 explored the 30 articles that were set out in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1948. The focus was on how they relate to their own (sporting) lives. It was decided to create written













instructions for the subdivisions of the RKB and Solijugend.

SPORT.MOVEMENT. SOLIDARITY

The travelling exhibition "Sport. Movement. Solidarity" presents the milestones and setbacks of the RKB in a clear and concise history: from its foundation in 1913 with almost 150,000 members as the second largest workers' sports association in the German Empire. From its growth to become the largest cycling association in the world in the first German democracy, until it was banned by the Nazis. From its reestablishment in 1945 as one of the few workers' sports and cultural associations. All members can also borrow the travelling exhibition.

GOOD RESULTS IN 2024

Probably the most important measure in 2024 was a workshop in mid-November, where creative methods were used to work on the association's mission statement. The aim was to clearly communicate internally and externally that any form of group-based misanthropy has no place in the RKB. Solijugend also celebrated its 70th anniversary in 2024, while its traditionally most important event, the international youth camp, was successfully organised for the 60th time.

The sporting successes in 2024 are also an incentive: Theresa Sielemann and Luisa Artmann became German cycling polo champions. Jana Pfann (women's single artistic cycling) and Neele Jodeleit and Kim Leah Schlüter (women's 2-man artistic cycling) won bronze at the UCI Indoor Cycling World Championships. With the dancers from 'Dancesport Heritage', another sporting pillar was added to the association. A contact that was established via the CSIT.

OUTLOOK 2025

It will be another eventful year. Solijugend and RKB are planning an event near the former venue of Frankfurt am Main to mark '100 years of the Workers' Olympics'. A meeting of skilled workers is organised, which is to be linked to the CSIT World Sports Games in Loutraki. Solijugend, which has been an accredited 'ERASMUS+' organisation since 2024, will play the main role in this. In the long term, digitalisation will be expanded in order to strengthen volunteering and make it more attractive, as well as to strengthen the international network of friendly contacts. Above all, the CIST World Sports Games in Loutraki, which many RKB athletes are already looking forward to!

ump rope has become a very popular sport. It is no longer just a pastime, but a high-performance sport for all age groups and all fitness levels. Whether alone at home or in a group in a sports hall. Jump rope can be practised as a leisure activity, in a demonstration team or now also as a championship up to world champion level.

Since the 1960s, jump rope has been regarded as a sport in its own right. Although the sport has been around for more than 60 years, it still has to fight for recognition and recognition to be more than just a children's activity. And it's more than time to prove them wrong!

The International Jump Rope Union IJRU 2023 World Championships in Colorado Springs (USA) were the biggest in history with more than 1200 athletes from 24 countries. The continental championships are now also reaching ever higher numbers of participants at each event. At the last European Championships there were 641 athletes from 12 countries. However, these championships are usually limited to existing jump rope communities.

During the 2024 Summer Olympics in Paris, a team of top athletes presented jump rope at a number of events, including the spectacular opening ceremony on and along the Seine. Through such activities at international sporting events, the

trend sport of jump rope is becoming increasingly well-known and popular with young and old alike.

However, people should not only get to know jump rope visually and as spectators, but also experience the variety of possible applications of a simple skipping rope for themselves, recognise the different variations of the sport and, in the best case, learn what you can do and achieve with a rope in your hands.

IRJU will be at the CSIT World Sports Games from 3 to 8 June 2025 in Loutraki (Greece) and will use the next big stage for some presentations of this very spectacular sport. There will be several opportunities to grab a rope, try yourself and experience the unexpected.

6 COUNTRIES SHARE 12 GOLD-MEDALS

olling, swinging and flying with elegance and power - performing spectacular spirals, somersaults and spins. The wheel becomes a partner when gymnasts steer it upright, rotate it horizontally or balance seemingly weightlessly on its struts. The 2024 Wheel Gymnastics World Championships took place 2024 in Almere, the Netherlands.

The Individual Finals closed the 2024 Wheel Gymnastics World Championships. Four gold medals for Germany, three for Switzerland and two for Israel - and the first medal ever for Denmark. In an afternoon packed with action, 12 medals were decided in the individual discipline finals at the 2024 World Championships in Almere. The juniors kicked off the competition, while the seniors took the floor over later. The public was treated to a series of stunning routines in all categories.

The pressure and nerves in these competitions ran high, with some signs of fatigue among the athletes. However, despite a few falls and mistakes, the audience was still treated to a selection of excellent routines. At this high level of competition, even the smallest mistake can cost a podium place. In the end, the athletes with the strongest nerves were the ones to show their full potential. In the spiral finals for the senior categories "E" difficulty elements came thick and fast. Rolls, handsprings and

Cyr-inspired spinning elements in spiral secured the gymnasts a high level of difficulty while the audience were able to enjoy a great variety of highclass routines.

The final competition category and overall highlight of the World Championships were the straightline routines to music, only performed in the senior category. Maneuvering in out of the wheel in positions which defy gravity. This is what the public saw in this last competition, from both women and men. Handstands on top of the wheel, twists and tumbling as well as dancing in the wheel. Beside the technical difficulties, the athletes charmed and flirted with the audience. Every gymnast incorporated a particular personality that was suited to the music and overall routine. We saw a wide range of styles, including a ballet dancer, a distressed girl, a strongman and a contortionist. It was

a fantastic experience and pleasure to watch the finalists, the best wheel gymnasts in the world.

The All Around Finals at the 2024 Wheel Gymnastics World Championships cast a spell of enchantment over the public. This proved to be a difficult decision with so much going on at the same time. Right from the start we were spoiled for choice, being treated to one highlight after the other. There were twisting somersaults in vault on one side of the gym, handsprings in spiral on the other side, while the women stole the main attention with their creative straight-line routines to music. The final Cyr Battle took everything one stage further. In four battle rounds, the new World Champions gave everything they had. This additional side event to the All Around finals was a definite hit for the audience with entertaining and surprising Cyr tricks.

HELD IN AN AMPHITHEATER, THE EVENT WAS ORCHESTRATED BY THE HELLENIC ORGANIZATION FOR COMPANY SPORT & HEALTH (HOCSH) UNDER THE LEADERSHIP OF PRESIDENT NIKOS KERASSOVITIS, ENSURING A SEAMLESS AND INCLUSIVE EXPERIENCE FOR ALL.

ollowing a brief introduction to the sport, attendees were invited to take part, generating an enthusiastic response. Loutraki's mayor, Georgios Gionis, a former professional volleyball player, led the charge as participants eagerly joined in. ICSBF President Elisabeth Speiser-Havel managed the game, efficiently quiding participants

through the simple rules that make Catch'n Serve Ball accessible to all. This ease of play is one of the sport's highlights, as it allows newcomers to quickly understand and enjoy the experience.

Beyond the game, President Speiser-Havel also contributed to the forum's theoretical segment with a presentation on the mission of the International Catch'n Serve Ball Federation (ICSBF), which was established last year. Her presentation outlined the federation's goals and extended an invitation for new members to join this growing community, reinforcing the forum's

theme of inclusion and impact. This interactive opening underscored the core values of CSIT and the ICSBF, bringing people together through sport and fostering a sense of unity across all participants.

The decision-making body of the International Catch'n Serve Ball Federation had the opportunity to present themselves also at the Congress meeting. Important topics included the successful CSIT Single Championships in Rovinj in June 2024, the development of a dedicated Catch'n Serve Ball and, of course, the upcoming 8th CSIT World Sports Games from 3 to 6 June 2025 in Loutraki.

Furthermore, reports were given on the activities of the various working groups and on the EU Mobility Project CnS4Coaches, which will







make it possible to finance training seminars in new countries. A milestone was the signing of the document by all ExCom members including Ethic Code and Guidelines for members, which from now on must also be signed by new members when they apply for membership.

The purpose of this document is to explain what kind of behavior ICSBF encourages and what kind of behavior is not accepted. It should

offer tools to create a respectful climate for the expansion of Catch'n Serve Ball and for quality activities. The aim is for everyone to feel valued in the sport and for the environment to be supportive and safe.







R.I.P.AVIGDOR DAGON

A great man has left the stage forever.

Avigdor Dagon was one of the last Holocaust survivors, a great friend and supporter of CSIT and personally present at almost all international events of the world association until the end. Hapoel Israel and the CSIT part with deep sadness and great appreciation for a great man with incredible charisma, a great human being and philanthropist with great vision. Avigdor Dagon passed away on September 22 at the age of 95. R.I.P.

Born in Poland, he was a committed and active member at the center of Hapoel for 65 years until 2023, when he stepped down from his functions and reduced his involvement. However, the "great" man was much more than just a dedicated employee. He was a true institution in the organization, a pillar of support, a man who dedicated his life to promoting its verbal values and spreading its name, both in Israel and through his international connections abroad.

As early as 1958, Avigdor Dagon established the Hapoel branch in Ramat Hasharon and later served as secretary of Hapoel in Ramat Gan-Givatayim and secretary of the Dan district. His endless love for the organization made him a role model for many. Avigdor positively influenced generations of leaders and employees with his help, advice and wisdom. It is always right to help, support and enrich those around him with his vast experience. His great contribution and spirit will continue to accompany Hapoel.
